2	Therese Phelps	Plumas does not have wording regarding child care on our summons
3	Diane Collins	Mendocino County does not have that wording on our summons
4	Bea Gin	Same for San Joaquin County
5	Edwina Harper	Yolo does not have wording regarding child care on our summons, but we do address the issue on our web site under frequently asked questions; where we state that we do not provide day care and we ask that they please make other arrangements for their children's care.
6	Diana Gifford-Tuggle	Shasta County does not use any information regarding the lack of child care on our summons
7	Carol Sharek	Tehama does not have wording regarding child care on our summons. Thanks, Carol
8	Tammy Boragnine	Amador County does not have wording on our summons with regards to child care.
9	Sherry Spears	We don't have anything on our summons in Fresno. We do have childcare available for court users that jurors can use as well but we don't advertise it for fear it would overwhelm the child waiting room. So we let jurors know it's available if appropriate but most probably don't use.
10	Margaret Sackrider-White	Alpine is the same as Plumas.
11	Dolores Curiel	Merced's Jury Summons does not have wording regarding no child care or no children at the Court. We do receive calls from prospective jurors asking about children and our staff informs them, that they should not bring any children with them.
