

MILEAGE for JURORS

In Fresno we calculate juror mileage by the furthest point (as the crow flies) within each zip code area to the court. To do this we order a county zip code map for our calculations. We have some new zip codes in our county and I need to order an updated map. In the past we've ordered maps from a specific vendor but not all our zip codes were included so I'm looking to possibly change vendors. If your court uses any zip code maps could you please let me know which vendor you order from and if you are satisfied with the maps that you receive

1	Diane Collins	Mendocino County has a place for them to tell us mileage, one way from home, on the portion of the summons they bring with them on the first day of appearance. Some of our zip codes can have a difference of mileage as much as 30 miles so that is not an accurate usage for us.
2	Diana Gifford-Tuggle	Shasta - For the most part we rely on the information our jurors provide on their summons when they check in for attendance. If the claimed mileage does not appear correct, we use either Map Quest or Rand McNally maps for the mileage. This only takes a few minutes, if we cannot take the time when jurors are checking in, we do it when we are entering phone numbers and pay codes.
3	Esperanza Esparza	In Del Norte we let the jurors tell us their mileage from their home to the courthouse by way of a signed portion of their summons that they must bring with them to jury duty. On this same slip, they tell us whether they waive all fees or must per diem
4	Margaret Smith	Tuolumne handles the same way as Shasta. Margaret Smith
5	Diana LaFlumboise	In Madera, beginning on the 2 nd day of service we have them complete their mileage/fee forms. If they indicate they want to be paid for mileage we YAHOO their miles. We inform the jurors that they can check their mileage with us and it is correct 99% of the time (unless they take the scenic route which we don't pay them for, lol!). We then enter those miles in the Juror Information screen in JSI
6	Debbie Cravea	Napa is the same as Shasta...
7	Debbie Jurevich	San Benito asks the jurors what the mileage was one way from the jurors home.
8	Richard Goldner	Ventura – By Zip Code, shortest driving path that has been calculated and put into JSI Next Gen system. (Rounding up to whole mile) CCP 215(c) - ... shall be reimbursed for mileage at the rate of 34 cents per mile for each mile actually traveled in attending court as a juror... *We just want to make sure they avoid scenic and prolonged traveling routes.
9	Lupe Castaneda	Santa Clara Court uses the same method as Ventura
10	Rebecca Hayes	Monterey County is the same as Yolo
11	Bea Gin	Same for San Joaquin
12	Carol Sharek	Tehama is the same as Shasta County
13	Margaret Sackrider-White	Alpine is the same as San Benito
